

# Media Servers

Strictly, Media Servers are hardware and software to manipulate and run media (audio, video, still images) which can be remote controlled by lighting consoles. But then, the Media Servers listed here are usually controlled like any other intelligent fixture via DMX/Art-Net/sACN: you patch them and set their attributes. Hence, this is only a list of media servers and media control software which are available to standard control mechanisms. Most of those have various control inputs, i.e. react to Art-Net, MIDI and timecode. Details are available in the respective manual.

<a href="#">ArKaos Mediamaster Pro</a>	<a href="#">ArKaos</a>	only the pro series does Art-Net, CIP etc.
<a href="#">Artnet Emu</a>	<a href="#">Jesper Hermandsen</a>	An Art-Net listener for controlling Winamp, VLC media player and iTunes for Windows
<a href="#">Catalyst</a>	Developed by High End Systems aquired by Barco now most info available at <a href="#">SNP Productions Ltd.</a>	As far as I know Catalyst still doesn't CIP and has only limited means of control - but has other strengths.
<a href="#">Disguise</a>	<a href="#">Disguise</a>	formerly known as d3 technologies. Very versatile highend media sverer
<a href="#">Hippotizer</a>	<a href="#">Green Hippo</a>	does also CIP thumbnails
<a href="#">Katrin Media Server</a>	<a href="#">Alexander Logvinov</a>	free-of-cost media server with Art-Net control for Mac
<a href="#">KluitNET - ArtNet for PowerPoint</a>	<a href="#">Kluit.net</a>	very simple yet effective Art-Net plugin for PowerPoint
<a href="#">Madrix</a>	<a href="#">Inoage</a>	very popular in clubs. Very strong in pixelmapping. Can do lots of protocols.
<a href="#">Maxedia</a>	<a href="#">Martin</a>	Discontinued. One of the first popular media servers.
<a href="#">Mbox</a>	<a href="#">PRG</a>	Sorry, I cannot say anything about it. Seen it on big events already.
<a href="#">MX Wendler</a>	<a href="#">MX Wendler</a>	focused on architectural use, strong focus on timeline
<a href="#">Pandoras Box</a>	<a href="#">Coolux by Christie</a>	very professional media server with mighty editing capabilities, There are personalities for it and it can do CIP but as the DMX functionality can be changed by the user, personalities are of limited use.
<a href="#">Pixera</a>	<a href="#">AV Stumpf</a>	sorry, still new to me, but definitely a highend system
<a href="#">Resolume Avenue/Arena</a>	<a href="#">Resolume</a>	very popular in clubs but also used for big events and installations. Only Arena can be DMX-controlled. As now Art-Net control can - and must be - freely assigned, Charlotte Gowers made a guide on how to control Resolume Arena. <a href="#">Screen Monkey</a>	<a href="#">Screen Monkey</a>	affordable, very versatile solution. Popular in houses of worship but also in clubs and exhibitions. Can also be used to trigger Powerpoint etc.

vVVV	vVVV group	multi-purpose toolkit which can be used for almost everything - but be warned, it has a steep learning curve. You need to build everything yourself in vVVV's node-based engine. There is now pre-made personality - you can make it listen to Art-Net and then build a personality as required.

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
