Explanation

This explains the functional steps within the sequence. For all the other XML details please refer to [Formats and syntax](#)

- `<step>UserMacros.SetCurrentMacroFromUserNumber(1)</step>` makes the macro with the user number 1 current, i.e. selects it. Change the number if you want to export another macro.
- `<step>UserMacros.Export(UserMacros.CurrentMacroId)</step>` actually exports the previously selected macro - all the file handling is done in this function

How to use it

1. [make this macro available](#)
2. create another macro and give this macro usernumber 1
3. find the Export macro in the show library or via <Macro> [View All] and execute (click) it
4. open Windows explorer and navigate to your [usermacro location](#)
5. there you'll find a file named Macro1.xml - this is the exported macro
